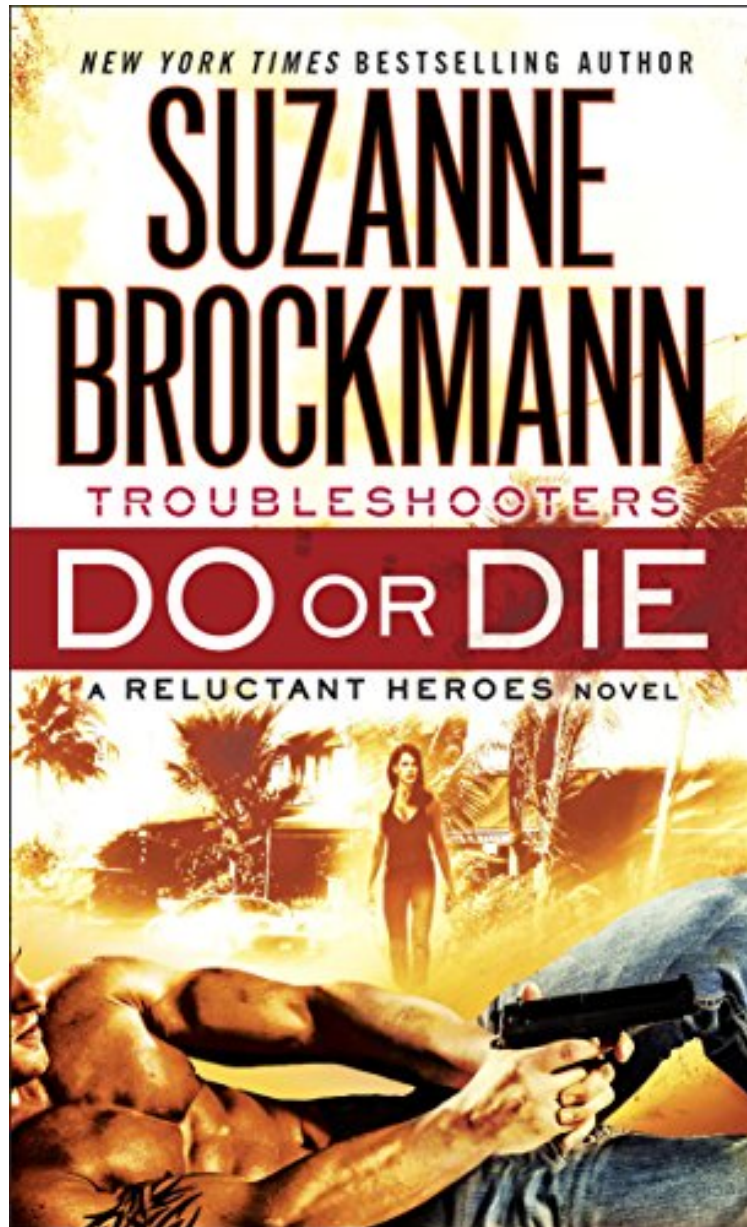

Es war mir bewusst, dass es eine Seitenhandlung ist und nicht richtig in die Reihe passt. Ich fand das Buch leider völlig enttäuschend. Das gesamte Buch konnte mich nicht fesseln.
